Mill Projects Update	<ul> <li>Approximately 3 weeks until civil works are complete.</li> <li>Mechanical and Electrical installation starting around Easter</li> <li>Planning to start commissioning in August.</li> <li>The treatment plant will pay for itself by lowering BOD<sub>5</sub> costs (Sydney Water sewer costs)</li> <li>The quality of Orora effluent will be higher than Malabar effluent – leading to better ocean outfall quality.</li> <li>Energy generation using the biogas is another benefit of the plant, but not the main reason for building it.</li> <li>Long Dam Improvements</li> <li>Long Dam is part of the Mill's bore water system and is in need of repair and maintenance.</li> <li>Council approval has recently been received for sheet piling.</li> <li>Once started, the job should take around 3 months to complete.</li> <li>B7 Demolition</li> <li>Orora has approval in principle from the EPA and Department of Planning to build a temporary noise wall behind B7.</li> <li>The wall will be around 140 metres long, and run along the Mill boundary behind B7.</li> <li>The wall will be constructed of shipping containers, stacked 4-high. These will be arranged with visual amenity in mind.</li> <li>After the Hangar Block is developed, Orora will determine the best permanent noise solution for the site.</li> <li>Orora is hoping the temporary wall will be built in April, after</li> </ul>	Karl Achleitner

- Demolition of B7 is likely to take 6 months to complete.
- A community flyer will be sent out in March informing local residents of the plan.
- KJ asked whether the group thinks that a temporary wall of shipping containers would be an issue to local residents. GO replied that as long as the residents knew the plan before the wall went up, and understood that it was a temporary wall (and not being used for container storage), then he doesn't believe it would be an issue.

Overview of main site issues

 Botany Mill is feeling the pressure of energy and raw material price increases. Karl Achleitner

- Waste paper feedstock costs are increasing by approximately 50%, driven by the world market
- Electricity costs may double next financial year on this site.
